Then look no further! CRCC Madang has been designed to support you by offering learning opportunities and creating a community of KA CRCC pastors through networking to meet the needs and demands of CRCC ministry. CRCC Madang is a six-month program that begins with a week-long retreat followed by a series of bi-weekly online courses.

CRCC Madang is offered in two tracks: CRCC Madang class of 2025 for those attending Madang for the first time and CRCC Madang Reunion for graduates.

CRCC Madang is peer designed weeklong retreat and webinars to continue equipping CRCC pastors for ministry and building up the KA CRCC community through networking.

Information for CRCC Madang Class of 2025

ELIGIBILITY: Must be serving in CRCC appointment/ministry and have been in CRCC Appointment less than 8 years.

CLASS SIZE: 15 participants for the class of 2025 CRCC Madang. Admission is granted on a first come, first served basis.

WHEN: CRCC Madang begins with a retreat May 5-9, 2025, and followed by a series of webinars from July to November 2025 (bi-weekly).
